Gospel reading

Luke 2:1-20

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, ‘Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.’ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, ‘Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!’

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, ‘Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.’ So, they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

SERMON – Pastor Joseph Dillion

Christmas Eve, December 24, 2020. “Shepherds.” Bethany

2020 has been a year that has seemed to go forever. The majority of our plans for this year wiped out, and now Christmas and much of its’ joy seems beyond our reach and many of our people feel abandoned and unable to reach out even to family and loved ones. In some ways, we may feel closer to one set of people who were witnesses that night of Jesus’ birth than we realize. For when that night began, the shepherds in the fields were often some of the most forgotten, despised people in all of Judea. On this night as we hear again the Christmas story, let us hear another side of the story. The story as seen from the shepherds and the life that they had to deal with in those days.

We shepherds of old need to extend a thousand thanks to those children and others who have portrayed us in Christmas plays down through the centuries. They have made us seem respectable, and to be perfectly frank at the time that our Lord was born we were not respectable in the least.

We were despised; we could not testify in courts because everyone thought that we lied all the time. Because shepherding was seen as low-class work, and yes we did have some thieves, and yes there were a few who were running from authorities, but

they were the exception and not the norm for us. But because of the few we are marked with being those who were not to be trusted. Also, our profession was considered unclean by the religious authorities. We couldn't worship with our families, with our friends, we felt unwanted by the majority of our communities, be it in our towns and villages and certainly in Jerusalem. Oh, I know that there are a few of you men who feel like you're here because your wives drag you, but we didn't even have that option to come and complain! Because of that we were a pretty irreligious lot. If God didn't want us because He saw us as unclean, well bluntly we didn't want to be bothered with God. I think some of you may know that feeling. Our thought was, if all God was interested in were the 'clean ones' then let Him have them?

Then came 'that' night. It was a quiet night—strangely quiet some thought, the sheep were quiet. The wind was still. It was as through—well it was through there was a feeling of expectation in the air. Like the earth itself was waiting for something. For someone. Some of us gathered around the evening fire and were talking—telling some irreverent stories if the truth be known after all these centuries.

Then suddenly there was this unbelievably bright light all around us—it as through the sky lit up at the snap of a finger from horizon to horizon. I cannot begin to tell you of the fear we all felt at that moment. We were sure that we were all going to die! Then in the midst of that light, a figure appeared and were sure we were dead. When he spoke the whole of the ground and the air seemed to shake and vibrate! "Fear Not" were the first words out of his mouth—easy for him to say! But at least we knew that we would survive a little longer. Then he told us something that was just astounding—unbelievable really—at least words such as these coming to the likes of us. He said: "Listen, I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people. Today in the town of David a savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. And here is a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." This was the child that Israel—that the world had been waiting for, for centuries. This child was the one who would bring peace to the world—to us. And the news of his birth came to us—to us the outcast of Israel! We the irreverent, the doubters—this great news came to us. So that night we learned that God does care about us after all! I cannot tell you the emotions that each of us felt in that moment. Awe! Thanksgiving! Hope! Tears were running down our eyes. The sense of love that washed over us was indescribable! But happened next was even more beyond words—from horizon to horizon the sky was filled with legion after legion of the heavenly armies of God signing to us—to the world! "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace to those who enjoy his favor." It was then that all of us realized that even though we were the lowest of the low, we also enjoyed God's favor, and it was we, who God had graced with the news of the birth the Messiah.

As suddenly as they had come to us the left us, and back into the heavens the angels went. We decided we had to go to Bethlehem to see this child that the angels had told us about. Somehow, we knew that the sheep would be OK. We ran to Bethlehem. I can't tell you how we knew where to go in Bethlehem, but we did, and there in a stable cave was a family with a new born child wrapped in swaddling clothes in the manger just as the angel had told us. The mother was young, the father a little older, and we told them of what had taken place out in the fields. They were just as amazed as we were.

The child—well yes, this is after all is about that child that Mary was holding. It was clear that nothing would ever be the same again. Such a feeling of love, of hope, of the world turning up-side-down. Our lives would never be the same again because of this child.

We have no doubts that God who told us about this child—the God who comes to us in this child cares about you as He cares about us. No matter how dark the world seems and is He is with us; He cares for us; He brings us hope when it seems that there is no hope to be had. Fear not! The angel said, for today in the town of David a savior has been born to you—and for you. Amen.
